Merrillville Education Foundation Major Saver Campaign

The MEF is excited to be offering Major Saver cards for sale through the Merrillville schools. Students received the sales packets after the kick-off assembly on Thursday, March 14th. The sale will last approximately ten days. Proceeds from the sale of Major Saver cards directly support the participating schools and the activities of the MEF. All of the money generated from this fundraiser goes back to the children. In this way, John Wood School can fund innovative and creative projects in the classroom and school and allow students to have broad educational experiences.

From 2002, when the Merrillville Education Foundation was started, through 2018, John Wood School has been awarded \$38,414.26 in teacher grants and Major Saver fundraising.

Major Saver cards will once again be only \$10 each. They can be purchased via cash, check or online at www.majorsaver.com. The online sale can be credited back to a particular student and school. All cards purchased online will be **mailed** directly to the customer. Administrators, teachers, and MCSC employees can also purchase cards to support this initiative.

Major Saver cards can also be purchased, and credited to a student, through the Major Saver App. Once the free app is downloaded to an Android or iOS device, buyers can choose a Major Saver card through the "buy cards" tab on the app. Once the buyer completes the transaction the offers will be stored in the Major Saver App. Patrons can then redeem offers directly from the app and do not need a physical card.

Major Saver is making online sales easier for friends and family! On our homepage you are able to enter your student's information to create a CUSTOM LINK for your child that can be shared via social media or

email. This link will automatically credit the online sale to your student when friends and family use the link to make their purchase!

Major Saver stresses safe selling and discourages door to door campaigning. The company encourages students to sell to family members, church patrons, neighbors, or other adults the family may know; and to always make sure their parents are involved.

Music in Our Schools Month

March is Music in Our Schools Month. This is a good time to draw attention to the importance of music education. Music is included as a stand-alone academic subject in the ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act, the 2015 federal law covering K-12 public education).

Music education helps students academically in several ways. The combined results of 30 studies indicate that music instruction has a significant positive effect on reading. Music study helps tune the brain's auditory system which helps students recognize speech and letter sounds. Students who continue music throughout high school scored an average of 91 points higher on the SAT test. (College Board, 2009 data) Students who participate in high quality music programs score higher on standardized tests than students in schools with deficient music programs, regardless of socioeconomic level. (Journal of Research in Music Education, 2007) Schools with strong music programs have higher graduation and attendance rates than schools that do not. A recent study showed that 10 years of instrumental study as a child can improve your memory in old age. These are just a few examples of the benefits of music education.

Music teaches lessons that are not taught elsewhere. Music education helps develop emotional awareness, self-reflection and self-discipline. In music, students learn skills that are important for achieving future success, including curiosity, creativity, and collaboration. In addition, music teaches the importance of hard work and persistence. One must work hard, practice, and persevere to succeed.

To many, a pop tab is just a piece of aluminum with one purpose – to open a can. But to the Ronald McDonald House of Indiana, the pop tab is a valuable resource. Why? Coach's Corner

Students need to be fluent in their math facts to be successful in math. We can practice with flash cards at home, but there are more ways to learn than just memorization.

Skip Counting (These can be brain breaks!)

Students can skip count to the answer. Here are some very cute videos for multiplication that would teach the strategy of skip counting. The teacher took current songs and changed them to multiplication songs. You can use these for brain breaks as your kids learn the lyrics and subsequently their math facts. Beware they are catchy and you may be singing them everywhere! This link is to his channel which has songs for twos to tens. <https://bit.ly/2lhE0mN> (Case sensitive). You can also search on YouTube for Mr. DeMaio.

Paired Facts

Another strategy to help your child is to link facts together. Link their knowledge of 2s to the 4s. (and 3s to 6s) (and even 4s to 8s!)

$$2 \times 3 = 6 \text{ so...} 4 \times 3 = 12$$

(The 2 doubled to 4 so the answer doubled as well.)

$$2 \times 6 = 12 \text{ so...} 4 \times 6 = 24$$

(again, the 2 doubled to 4, so the new product doubles as well)

$$3 \times 5 = 15 \text{ so...} 6 \times 5 = 30$$

(3 doubles to 6)

Kindergarten Registration Information Spring 2019

The Merrillville Community School Corporation invites our Ross Township residents to register for Kindergarten! Registration for students who will be five on or before August 1, 2019 will be on April 9, 2019 and on April 11, 2019 between 8:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. at your designated home school. If you are unsure of which school your child should attend, please go to <http://trans.mvsc.k12.in.us/elinkrp/search.aspx>

It is imperative that you enroll your kindergartener at this time to ensure they will attend their home school. If you are not able to register during this time, please call your child's school to schedule an appointment. Please note: Immunization restrictions hinder us from enrolling children on the first day of school. Delaying registration could also have an effect on your child receiving bus service the first day(s) of school.

The following is required to register:

- His/Her original **STATE BOARD of HEALTH Birth Certificate**
(we are unable to accept the certificate given by the hospital)
 - Court issued custodial papers (if applicable)
 - His/Her **immunization record**
 - Your **Driver's license** or **State issued photo identification card**
(your ID should reflect your Ross Township address)
- AND**
- **Proof of Ross Township Residency**
(see below for a list of acceptable documents to prove residency)

HOMEOWNERS

Two (2) of the following items are required:

- Utility Bill (NIPSCO, water, or sewer)
- Deed, Contract or Mortgage Statement
- Lake County Tax Bill

PENDING HOMEOWNERS

(Pending defined as 30 days prior to occupancy)

- Letter, on realtor letterhead, of pending purchase and projected date of move-in *and* the name/address of purchasing family.
- Letter, on contractor letterhead, validating pending construction of home and projected move-in date *and* name/address of purchasing family.
- Offer to Purchase/Purchase Agreement/Contract

RENTERS/LEASERS

Lease/Rent Agreement – Must include ALL of the following: parent/guardian name, school age students on the agreement as tenants, name and phone number of the manager/landlord and beginning and ending date of agreement. *The school maintains the right to contact the landlord to confirm residency.*

One (1) of the following items is required:

- Utility Bill (NIPSCO, water, or sewer)
- Vehicle Registration
- TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) letter from the State of Indiana

If you personally are unable to provide the proof of residency as a result of residing with a family or individual, they MUST accompany you to the registration. The resident will be required to provide documents proving Ross Township residency, their driver's license or state issued photo identification reflecting the Ross Township address, and complete an addendum form in the presence of a school resource officer (SRO).
